The office of Mine Safety and Inspection is located in the underground mining and heavy industrial section of Alabama at 11 West Oxmoor Road, Suite 100, in Birmingham, Alabama. The Mine Safety and Inspection Section is concerned with six main functions:

Making inspections to determine compliance with State Mine Safety Laws and Land Reclamation Laws and taking appropriate enforcement action.

Preparing rules and regulations for the prevention of accidents and maintenance of healthy working conditions in the mining industry and preparing these for submission to the Board of Appeals.

Providing information to the public; conducting educational programs to promote safety and health in places of employment; organizing safety programs or safety departments in the State's mining industry.

Investigating and preparing studies, compiling statistics and publishing reports about the condition of safety devices and methods of protection against accidents, illness and death in employment.

Supplying state schools and colleges with literature concerning the Alabama Coal Mining Law as well as Safety Rule Manuals and other publications concerning both underground and open pit mining for use in industrial and mining courses. These manuals also are supplied to mining firms for use in safety courses for mine foremen and fire bosses.

Administering a statewide recognition program for safety accomplishments within the companies and industries of Alabama, recognizing those employers, who, together with their employees exemplify a high level of safety consciousness in their everyday operations.

During fiscal year 2006, coal production reported in Alabama was 19,270,455 tons. Two fatalities occurred in coal mining during the year.

There were 605 complete inspections at mines. These required 842 field days by inspectors and resulted in 467 exceptions. There were 3,946 miners employed in the coal mining industry. An additional 1,993 miners were employed in open pits and quarries(non-coal).

Thirty-one miners received underground mine foreman certificates of competency. Fifty-five miners received surface mine foreman certificates of competency.
