### Crossville Resident Arrested and Convicted of Unemployment Compensation Fraud

MONTGOMERY—Alabama Department of Industrial Relations Director Tom Surtees announced today that a Crossville woman has been arrested and convicted for making false statements in claims for unemployment compensation benefits. This is a violation of the Alabama Unemployment Compensation Law.

Marsha Butler, of Crossville, DeKalb County, pled guilty to Theft of Property in the 1<sup>st</sup> Degree in the DeKalb County Circuit Court on March 6, 2009. An investigation by the Industrial Relations Benefit Payment Control Section determined that Butler received a total of \$4,645.00 in unemployment compensation benefits to which she was not entitled.

Butler was fined \$200, given a three year suspended jail term and ordered to pay restitution in the amount of unemployment benefits she received illegally.

“The Alabama Department of Industrial Relations, in cooperation with the offices of local District Attorneys, is continuing to actively pursue indictments and arrests of those who allegedly draw unemployment compensation benefits illegally,” said Surtees. “The successful prosecution of these cases helps to maintain the integrity of the state’s Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund, which is used to pay benefits to citizens who are truly qualified to receive the money.”
